

# What is the restriction about? (1/2)

- → Targets all PFAS (except a few potentially fully degradable sub-groups)
- → Covers all uses (except firefighting foams), including manufacturing
- → Proposes a ban with some derogations for specific uses, either for a limited (5 to 12 years) or unlimited time
  - Based on assessment of 14 sectors of use



# What is the restriction about? (2/2)

#### Sectors of use assessed (14 sectors)

- → Ski wax
- → Cosmetics
- Metal plating and manufacture of metal products
- Consumer mixtures and miscellaneous consumer articles
- → Petroleum and mining
- Food contact materials (FCM) and packaging
- Textiles, upholstery, leather, apparel, carpets (TULAC)

- → Construction products
- Applications of fluorinated gases
- → Transport
- → Medical devices
- → Energy
- → Lubricants
- → Electronics and semiconductors



# Where are we in the process? (1/2)

- → Restriction proposed by five countries (NL, DE, DK, SE, NO) January 2023
- → Consultation: March-September 2023, more than 5 600 comments/100 000+ pages
- → Update of proposed restriction ("background document") - June 2025
  - Assessment of 8 additional sectors of use
  - Proposal to implement measures to control risks
- → Evaluation ongoing by ECHA's Committees, RAC and SEAC





# Where are we in the process? (2/2)

#### Additional sectors of use (8 sectors)

- → Printing applications
- → Sealing applications
- Machinery applications
- → Other medical applications
- → Military applications
- → Explosives
- → Technical textiles
- → Broader industrial uses



## What happens next?

- → RAC and SEAC evaluation expected to conclude in March 2026
  - Adoption of RAC opinion (end of RAC process)
  - Agreement of SEAC draft opinion
- → Launch of SEAC draft opinion consultation
- Adoption of SEAC opinion expected by November/December 2026
- Combining both opinions into one and submission to European Commission expected by December 2026
- Decision by European Commission and EU member states





# What is the SEAC draft opinion? (1/2)

- → Presents SEAC's conclusions on whether proposal is "most appropriate to address risks taking into account proportionality of its benefits to its costs"
- → Structured by sections:
  - General sections (full scope of restriction):
    - Analysis of alternatives
    - Cost, benefits and proportionality
    - Practicality, etc.
  - Sector specific sections (14 sectors and PFAS manufacturing)



# What is the SEAC draft opinion? (2/2)

- → Important to keep in mind:
  - SEAC draft opinion contains separate sections on the evaluation of specific aspects related to PFAS manufacturing and original 14 sectors of use identified by dossier submitter in original restriction proposal
  - The draft opinion does not contain separate sections on the evaluation of 8 additional sectors of use assessed by dossier submitter in updated restriction proposal



# What is the consultation about? (1/2)

- → Launches soon after agreement of SEAC draft opinion in March 2026
- → Lasts for 60 days
- → Focuses on **content** of SEAC draft opinion:
  - Relevant comments to be analysed and considered for SEAC final opinion
  - Comments on other aspects of restriction (e.g. risks, emissions) not considered





# What is the consultation about? (2/2)

#### → Covers full restriction scope

- Interested parties are invited to provide comments related to all aspects of the opinion, including all sectors of use (14 sectors with specific sector evaluation by SEAC + 8 additional sectors + PFAS manufacturing)
- In addition, specific information related to the SEAC sector evaluation of 14 sectors of use and PFAS manufacturing to be requested in a structured way



→ EU Survey: European Commission's official survey tool

#### 1. Survey guidance document

What: Survey questions and instructions for responding

When: Mid December

#### 2. Use mapping

#### What:

- Stage 1: List of uses evaluated by SEAC to date
- Stage 2: Description of uses evaluated by SEAC
- Stage 3: Further elaborated description of uses evaluated by SEAC

When: S1: Right after webinar / S2: Mid-Dec / S3: Before consultation

#### General instructions for consultees

- → Types of questions: numerical, text, choices (multiple or best)
- → Evidence: where possible, back up choices with additional information
- → Uncertainty: pick what seems to be most plausible
- Perspective: what is the reporting unit for multisector companies?





#### Level of detail

- → Different levels of detail for general and sector-specific questions:
  - Answer general questions to best convey your information
  - Answer sector-specific questions at most granular level
  - Where necessary, add missing uses to sector-specific inquiry





#### Example: TULAC sector

- → Evaluation levels in textiles, upholstery, leather, apparel and carpets (TULAC) sector survey:
- Use: Home Textiles
   Use: Consumer apparel
- 3. Use: Professional apparel & PPE
  - 1. Sub-use: Professional Sportswear and uniforms
  - 2. Sub-use: PPE
    - 1. **Application**: Personal protective equipment (PPE) intended to protect users against risks as specified in Regulation (EU) 2016/425, Annex I, risk categories III(a) and III(c).
    - 2. **Application**: Personal protective equipment (PPE) intended to protect users against risks as specified in Regulation (EU) 2016/425, Annex I, risk categories III(b) and III(d-m)
    - 3. **Application**: Personal protective equipment (PPE) intended to protect users against risks as specified in Regulation (EU) 2016/425, Annex I, risk categories other than III.
    - 4. **Application**: Personal protective equipment (PPE) specifically designed for armed forces, the maintenance of law and order and other emergency response workers
    - 5. Application: Impregnation agents for re-impregnating of articles referred to above
- 4. Use: Leather



### Background information

- → Affiliation of respondent
- → Name (only for organisations)
- → Email address (in case of follow-up)
- → General information on organisation
- → For companies:
  - Size, turnover, entity type, role in supply chain, NACE industry code
- → Country of domicile





### Sector-specific questions: alternatives

- → Short description of PFAS use
- → Use volume to substitute:
  - Tonnes/year of polymeric PFAS, non-polymeric PFAS and fluorinated gases
- → Analysis of alternatives:
  - Conclusion, brief justification
- → Possibility to develop alternatives





### Sector-specific questions: impacts

- → What would a ban of **your** use of PFAS entail for your organisation?
- → Assume no derogation for **your** PFAS use was granted. What would be:
  - Expected annual profit loss
  - Expected job loss in the EU
  - Other negative impacts on society





### Sector-specific questions: conditions

- → Restriction option 3:
  - Continued use (time-limited or unlimited) under certain conditions
- → Not in original proposal
- → Now, chance to describe impacts





### General questions

- → Apply to full restriction scope
- Possibility to indicate to which sector of use responses apply
- → Information may refer to any use, including those not evaluated or identified in SEAC's draft opinion
- Follow structure of draft opinion general sections





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# Conclusions

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#### Conclusions

- What SEAC's draft opinion is and how your evidence will inform final opinion
- Consultation timeline: opens shortly after draft agreement (expected March 2026) and runs for 60 days
- How to submit: EU Survey with EU Login; use sector-specific and general surveys; no attachments, links not opened; mark confidential items per question
- What to focus on: alternatives, impacts and precise, sector specific use data
- Support: guidance document and use-mapping to be provided





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
